#### **Work Experience students**

Please report to our Junior School 09.00. You will have a short induction meeting and will meet our staff. You will then go directly to your work placement.

If you are following a course with us first you will have the induction meeting at the end of your first week instead. You will then go straight to your work placement on the Monday.

#### **Social Programme**

The social programme is included as part of your course. Discovery Students are given a new programme every week. In the summer we run up to 3 activity groups on the Discovery Programme, based on both age and English level. Students might change activity groups during their course as numbers change, or if they change class. All programmes include one evening activity and a Saturday day trip. Our junior programmes operate as normal on national holidays.

Explorer children are given a new programme every Monday. Explorer children need to be signed in and out each day by their parent/host family. Parents can collect their child at the end of the activities, we can provide lunchtime supervision if required.

Please note: Some activities start earlier than 14.00, please check your programme for information.

Many Devon beaches can be dangerous therefore; students must not swim unless a qualified lifeguard is present.

#### **Parent Meetings**

There is a meeting for parents of Explorers each Monday at 11.00am in the Junior Centre. In summer there is a meeting for parents of children on the Discovery Programme each Tuesday at 11.00am in the Junior Centre. Our Director of Studies is available in reception to speak to at other times if you have questions.

#### Studying at the Globe

Our Junior Centre has a common room for break and lunch times. Lunch is not provided by the school. For those in homestay accommodation a packed lunch is provided by their homestay family. For those not in a homestay we recommend that students bring a packed lunch and drink to school with them. Discovery students may leave the school at lunchtime if they wish. There are plenty of shops, cafes and restaurants close to the school. During break times students can enjoy the gardens and eat their lunch outside if the weather permits.

There is free Wi-Fi throughout the school, please ask if you need to use a computer.

#### **Homestay Accommodation**

The majority of our junior students stay with a homestay. This is a great way of improving your English and learning about life in Britain. Here are some general points to help you make the most of your stay.

You will be living in the family home. This is very different to a hotel. Please remember you are a guest and to respect your host family

Try to speak to your homestay about their routine (for example, meal times / times for using the bathroom).

You will eat evening meals with your hosts. This is a good time to practise your English. Please be on time for meals. If you plan to miss the evening meal tell your family the day before. English food is very different to other cuisines. If there is any food you don't like, please tell them. They want you to be happy and to eat well!

Your hosts will do some light laundry for you on a weekly basis. If you need more than this please ask them politely.

If you have a mobile phone, please give the number to your homestay and to the Globe. This is very useful in case we need to contact you. If you are ill please tell your homestay and call the Globe. We can arrange for you to see a doctor or dentist as needed.

If you break or damage anything please tell your homestay immediately. We understand accidents happen but an apology is always appreciated.

If your homestay gives you a key for the house, make sure you know how to lock the front door. If you lose the key please tell them and us immediately.

# Here are some questions that might help you communicate with your family

- What time is breakfast/ the evening meal/lunch at the weekends?
- What time should I get up on school days/at weekends?
- What time are you home on weekdays?
- What is the best time for me to have a bath / shower?
- Do you have Wi-Fi? Can I use it please?What is the password?
- Where should I put my dirty laundry?
- What areas of your home can I use? Are there any rooms I cannot go into?
- What is your mobile number in case I need to call you?
- Can my friends visit me in the evening?

Students placed in host families over 2.8kms from the school will automatically receive a free bus pass from us. Your host family will explain the bus route and bus times. Please ask them, (or a member of staff) if you do not understand or are not sure where to go.
