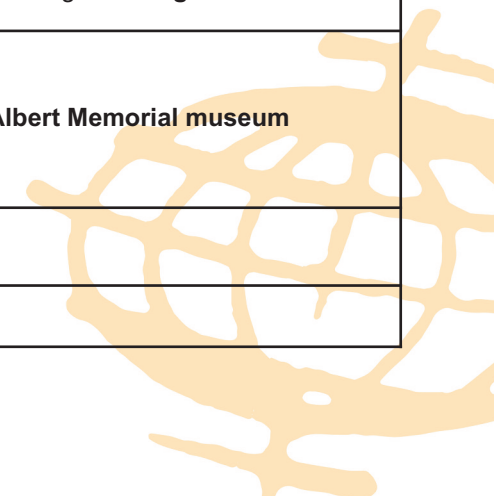

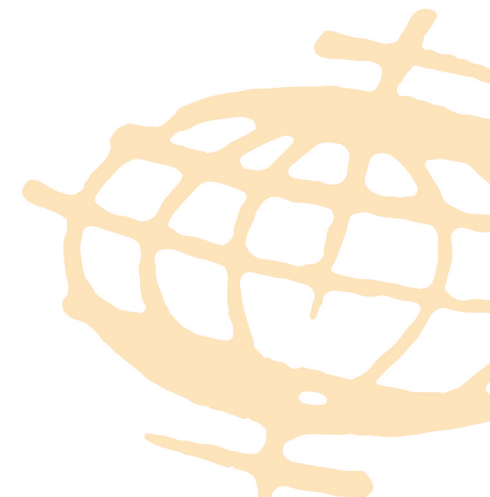

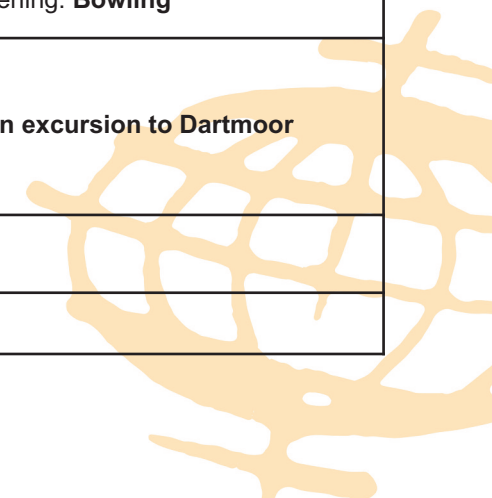
Course Facts
